In accordance with the latest CDC guidelines, we inform you that NUC University – Florida Technical College has updated the COVID 19 protocol to ease the face-covering requirement.

Effective immediately, in counties that have high, medium, or low levels of COVID cases will follow the rules below:

- LOW LEVEL Masks are **voluntary** inside the campus for counties reporting low levels.
- MEDIUM LEVEL- Masks are **voluntary** inside the campus for counties reporting medium levels.
- HIGH LEVEL Masks are **MANDATORY** inside the campus for counties reporting high levels

As of today 3/13/2022, all locations have LOW or MEDIUM COVID 19 community levels. Any employee, student and/or visitor at the campus may opt to not wearing a facemask.

We will monitor the weekly reports provided by the CDC and will publish every week. The campuses will post signs at all points of entry to inform of the facemask requirement status and notification will be sent if there are any changes to your Campus Category leading to the change in the requirements.

Please keep in mind that the COVID 19 protocol will continue in place:

Before visiting the campus, if you respond "YES" to any of the questions below, please refrain from going to campus or, if you have already traveled to campus, please exit the campus immediately and notify your Dean, Program Director, or Instructor:

- Are you still under an isolation or quarantine period for potential COVID-19 contagion?
- Have you had a fever or felt feverish in the last 72 hours?
- Are you experiencing any new respiratory symptoms including a runny nose, sore throat, cough, or shortness of breath?
- Are you experiencing any new muscle aches or chills?
- Have you experienced any new change in your sense of taste or smell?
- Have you taken the COVID-19 test in the past 5 days, and have not received the results?
- Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the past 10 days?

We are moving in the right direction and want you to be safe thus help us stop the spread.
