



## **CRRSAA Act Funds Use First Quarter Report Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA Act)**

As indicated in Section 314(a)(4) of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA Act), we publish the following information for the benefit of the student population. This information was updated on **July 8, 2021** and includes information for the **quarter beginning on January 1, 2021 and ending on March 31, 2021**.

1. The institution signed and sent to the United States Department of Education the Certification and Agreement where NUC commits to use the funds received under the mentioned regulation to provide emergency scholarships to eligible students.
2. The institution has received from the Department a total of **\$12,108,244.00**, pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4).
3. During the **first quarter** ending on March 31, 2021, the institution distributed to students the amount of **\$9,787,200.00** under the emergency grant from Section 314(a)(4) the CRRSAA Act.
4. NUC, NUC-IBC and NUC-FTC have approximately **18,302** students eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA.
5. During the **first quarter** ending on March 31, 2021, **12,233** students have received the emergency scholarship under Section 314(a)(4) the CRRSAA Act.

6. The criteria for participating in this program included but was not limited to the following:
  - a. Eligible students with expenses related to the student’s cost of attendance or emergency costs that may arise due to coronavirus such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.

In addition to the criteria mentioned above, in order to participate in this grant, at the time funds were distributed, the student must have meet the following requirements:

- a. Was as a regular student enrolled in a degree or certificate eligible program and was attending the institution (on-ground and/or online).
- b. Completed a FAFSA 2020-21 and received a valid EFC

The institution prioritize students with exceptional need. The award amount was determined using the FAFSA 2020-21 information as follows:

<b>1-5711</b>	\$600.00
<b>5712 or more</b>	\$400.00

7. Students were provided with the option to execute the CRRSAA Student Consent Form if they wish to allow the institution to apply grant funds to satisfy any outstanding account balance at the institution. Completion of the CRRSAA Student Consent form is voluntary and is not required for CRRSAA funds to be disbursed to students.

Students were also notified that they may choose to decline the CRRSAA grant by emailing [stufinancialsupport@nuc.edu](mailto:stufinancialsupport@nuc.edu) with the message “No Expenses CRRSAA Funds” along with the student’s name and student ID. Funds were considered accepted unless the student sent the declination email by 03/12/2021.
